### Vegetation Removal


A key aspect of wildfire risk reduction is removing vegetation like shrubs, brushes, and weed wacking. This helps reduce the amount of potential wildfire fuel in the area. Fire and forestry agencies rely on this data to assess the effectiveness of fuel reduction efforts.

### Wildfire Mitigation Efforts - Hours Worked by Type

- **Home Hardening Hours** Examples include cleaning roofs and gutters, fire resistant exterior improvements, vent screens, removing flammable items, and roof replacement or repair.
- **Landscaping (Zone 0 to 100ft from home) Hours.** Examples include Installation of hardscaping, replacing combustible mulches with stone/gravel options, tree and shrub removal, raking and removal of pine needles, leaves, ground litter/debris, tree trimming/limbing, moving firewood, lawn and native grass maintenance, etc.
- **Miscellaneous Hours.** Examples include meetings, presentations, program administration, home site visits, etc.
